The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.	£6897.15 (actual cost £13,794.30 – 50% paid for by the 'Friends of Bournes Green'.)	PE leader to monitor children's participation in physical activity. Provide a lunchtime club particularly focussing on those children who do not take part in any physical activity. Provide resources and physical equipment to promote active playtimes e.g. wooden climbing structure. Provide an astro turfed area for a wider variety of clubs/games to take place on safely. Play leader to introduce different types of physical activity/sports.	Through termly monitoring, 100% of children took part in daily physical activity each day. This has been implemented through: -a range of activities organised at lunch times to motivate active, physical playtimes and promote a love of sport - a new astro turfed area has enabled more children to be involved in physical activity -outside equipment has been purchased such as a wooden climbing structure, which has encouraged those children who do not enjoy team sports, to be independently active in their play -a wider variety of after school clubs are now on offer due to the turfed area in the playground -all children do 15minutes exercise daily during 'Wake and Shake sessions' led by teachers Further development 18/19 Introduce daily mile, 15 minute running for all children. Play leader to be supported by ASSA coaches to introduce different types of sports for all children during playtimes. Free active after school clubs led by teachers e.g. dance. Continue to provide sporting opportunities that the children may have not experienced before or have the chance to regularly take part in. This will take the form of 'experience days'.
